
## Arkansas National Guard Museum History Roundtable Finding the French Rock: de la Harpe (and a few other Frenchmen)

David Ware has served as state historian and director of the Arkansas State Archives since January 2021. Before this, he spent over 18 years as historian of the Arkansas State Capitol. He is a native of Washington DC, grew up in Nebraska and earned his Ph.D. in American history from Arizona State University. His career has included both academic and public history, as well as busking, rough carpentry and an extended stretch in the oil patch. He lives in Little Rock with his librarian-turnedarchivist-turned-librarian wife, daughter (when she is home from college) and their elderly Airedale in a small house filled with model trains,
